She serves on the University of South Carolina's Presidential Advisory Committee and the boards of the Medical University of South Carolina Foundation, Big Brothers Big Sisters of New York, National Council for Families and Television and The American Theatre Wing.

Smalls has a Master's Degree in Public Administration and a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from the University of South Carolina, where she was awarded an Honorary Doctorate of Humanities. She started the Marva Smalls Endowment which has awarded more than \$1 million

to programs providing opportunities for youth and families. She also established a \$1 million endowment for the University of South Carolina's Ronald McNair Center which offers scholarships and support to engineering students from under-represented populations.
